

Designs and implements the systems that govern the internal activities of the QFCC. This team manages the organisation's strategic, performance, human resources, and financial management systems and oversees Parliamentary submissions and cross-government engagement as well as providing secretariat services for internal committees and the Child Death Review Board.

Provides systematic analysis to ensure systems are accountable for the impact they have on children and families. This includes producing analytical, research and evaluation reports that explore the performance of key government systems – including the legislation, policy, practice and funding. The Operations Group includes the Monitoring and Evaluation, System Review and Child Death Prevention Teams that draw together evidence and the experiences of children, families and stakeholders to produce high-impact recommendations to improve the safety and wellbeing of Queensland's children and their families. Builds and maintains the public brand of the QFCC, managing the reputation of the organisation, and encouraging best practice youth participation. This team delivers a multi-disciplinary marketing, media and communications service to the organisation to raising awareness and advocating for children and their families – this includes leading the youth participation framework implementation and the management of the QFCC Youth Advisory Council.

Leads work focussed on our explicit commitments to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children and families, and advancing the rights of children in Queensland. This team influences and advocates across government to ensure the experiences of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children are free of systemic racism and to increase the rights of children and the responsibility of everyone to protect and promote those rights.
