2023–24 Workplan Acquittal April 2024



Background

The Queensland Family and Child Commission (QFCC) introduced its Forward Oversight Framework 2023–27 in June 2023 to provide better clarity about how it undertakes key statutory functions under section 9 of the *Family and Child Commission Act 2014* to review and improve the systems that protect and safeguard Queensland children and their families.

In 2023, the QFCC published the <u>2023–24 Oversight Forward Workplan</u>, which sets out the discrete examination and discovery review projects to be prioritised over the 2023–24 financial year and beyond.

The Oversight Framework commits the QFCC to brief stakeholders on progress, to revisit the relevance of listed reviews, and to seek input and consider emerging issues to add to the workplan. Figure 5 in the Oversight Framework (p.15) outlines that the workplan is to be updated annually in January, with a progress update and outcomes to be reported annually in July.

Process for updating the Forward Oversight Workplan

The 2023-24 Forward Oversight Workplan has been undergoing active review over recent months.

The review has included individual meetings with key agencies, staff input and written feedback from Ministers and Directors-General of key agencies and members of the QFCC Advisory Council on a draft 2024 workplan.

Feedback was received from several agencies. All feedback has been considered, and most has been incorporated.

The rest of this document outlines what has changed between the 2023–24 Forward Oversight Workplan, and the updated 2024 Forward Oversight Workplan.

Paediatric sepsis mortality An analysis of sepsis related child deaths to better understand the incidence of childhood sepsis and identify opportunities to better identify, treat and prevent it.	As part of the Safer Pathways Through Childhood framework, the Queensland paediatric sepsis mortality study was published in February 2024.
Growing up in Queensland – voices and stories A compendium of stories by children and families across the life domains with specific focus on out-of-home care and youth justice cohorts.	Based on the Australian Research Alliance for Children and Young People (ARACY) NEST framework, this publication will feature stories collected from Queensland children and families about the six life domains as a companion to the Growing up in Queensland data compilation project.
Mental health assessments in the youth justice system An exploration and analysis of the fitness to plead, soundness of mind and Mental Health Court process, including mapping the frequency of assessments, impact of delays in the Childrens and Mental Health Courts and mechanisms for ensuring the prioritization of young people in the mental health court. This project will involve an international scan of alternative models and their impacts and outcomes.	Following ongoing and intensive efforts in Queensland to address the offending of children and young people, and the uninterrupted flow of children into the youth justice system, this project aims to re-think the legal response to offending behaviour by young people and investigate the success of alternative responses.
Responding to children as victims of domestic and family violence A review of interventions specifically designed to respond to children in families where domestic and family violence (DFV) occurs, including an examination of their effectiveness at disrupting the intergenerational nature of DFV and its ongoing impact for individuals.	Following the work of the Women's Safety and Justice Taskforce which reported in 2022, as well as the Special Taskforce on Domestic and Family Violence in Queensland which reported in 2015, this project aims to assess what impact the response to domestic and family violence in Queensland has had on the experiences of children and young people.
