

Recognise it. Report it.

If you believe a worker has harmed a child, report it.

Every child has the right to be safe, no matter where they are. The Reportable Conduct Scheme strengthens how organisations identify, report and respond to concerns about harmful conduct towards children.

Reportable conduct is:

Child sexual offences

Sexual acts involving a child, grooming, or child exploitation material

Sexual misconduct

Showing a child sexual or age-inappropriate images or videos

Ill-treatment

Cruel, degrading or inappropriate treatment of a child

Significant neglect

Serious failure to meet a child's basic needs, safety or wellbeing

Physical violence

Using or threatening physical force against a child

Significant emotional or psychological harm

Behaving in a way that makes a child fear they will be harmed

If you witness, suspect, or receive information about reportable conduct:

- Report it to the organisation's CEO, child safeguarding lead, or the Queensland Family and Child Commission.
- Take all concerns of harm to children seriously and act promptly.
